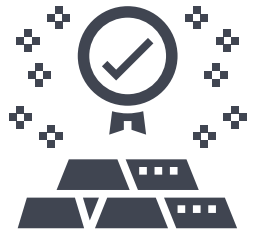




What do the terms high value and high quality care mean? A rapid review

Background

Methods



We included all study types (including editorials and opinion pieces)

We searched databases (MEDLINE (PubMed), Embase, and Google Scholar) and grey literature (government and non-government policy documents)

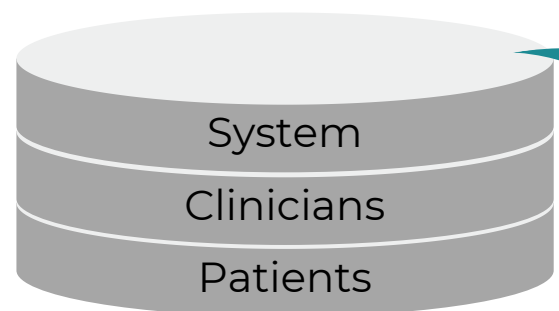
We used the terms, 'high value care' and 'high quality care' limited to English language (no other limitations)

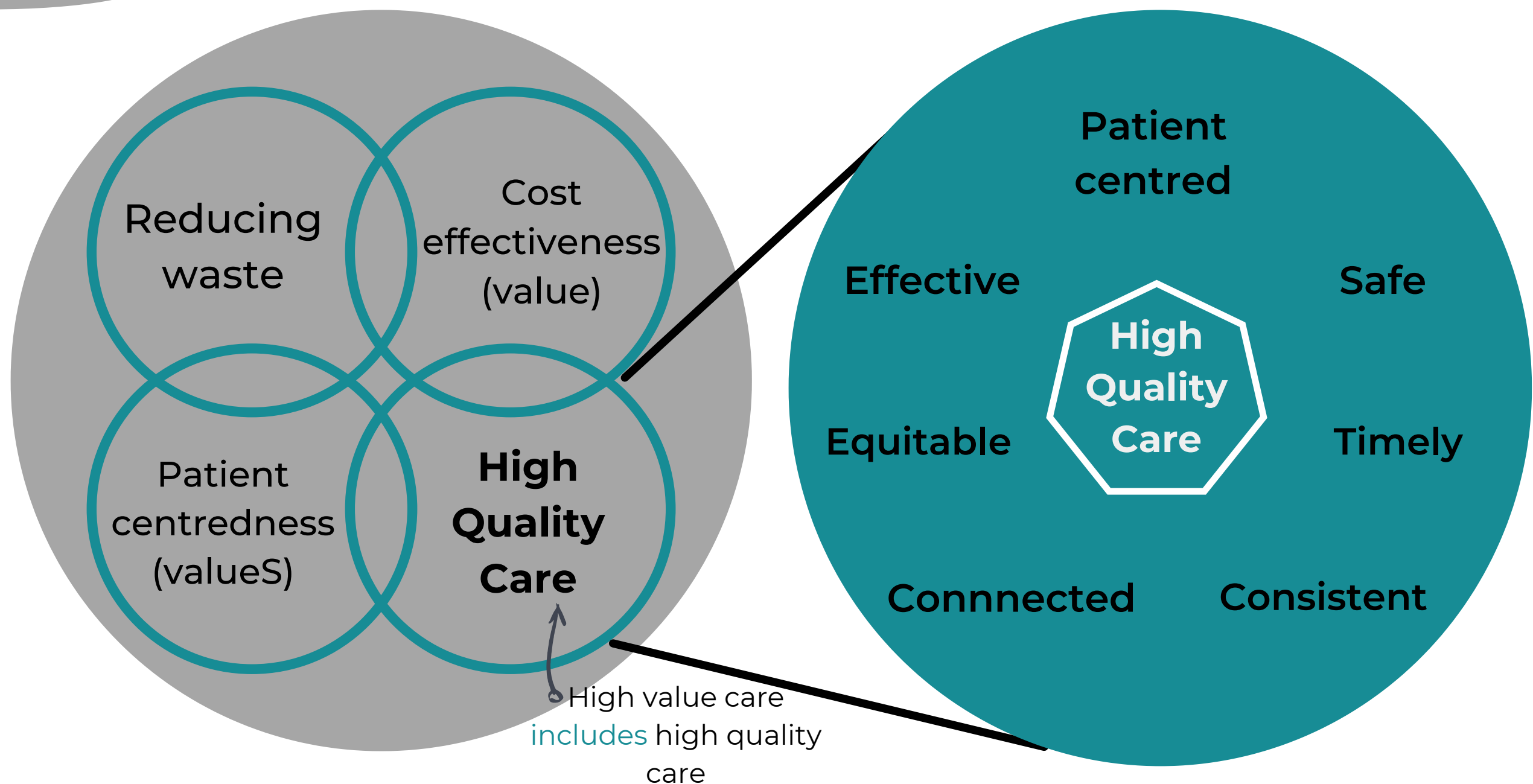
We aimed to:

Stakeholder groups may help define and influence high value and high quality care; high value and high quality care works within and through each of these groups.



High Value Care

Definition: Care that delivers most value for the patient and the clinical benefits outweigh the costs to the individual or system providing the care.

Consists of 4 'domains'

High Quality Care

Definition: Effective, safe care that is patient-centred, consistent, timely, equitable and allows easy interaction with healthcare providers and healthcare systems.

Consists of 7 'domains'
